FLAT RATE PENSIONS: OLD PROVISIONS

Rule E9 of the Firemen's Pension Scheme Order 1992 sets out the amount of each type of flat rate pension that could apply on the death of a firefighter subject to that Order. For most firefighters serving today, the standard benefits provided under the FPS in the event of his or her death would be far higher than the optional flat rate pension. Consequently Rule E9 is rarely used nowadays.

However, for older, retired firefighters a flat rate pension could well be relevant. Upon the death of a retired firefighter, fire pensions administrators must look up the level of benefit due to any dependant and uprate in line with Pensions Increase Acts and Orders. If the benefit due is a flat rate pension, this will be the level of pension set out in the FPS Order in force at the time the firefighter retired. This could be any of the eight FPS Orders in force since 1948.

As time passes, some of the old provisions become more difficult to interpret or even to trace.

This Annexe sets out the flat rate pensions given in the seven FPS Orders which preceded the FPS 1992 and explains how those pensions should be uprated in line with Pensions Increase Orders.

Background

"Half rate" spouses' pensions were not introduced until 1972, "third rate" spouses' pensions were not introduced until 1966. Before 1966 the spouse's pension would be of a fixed amount set by the relevant FPS Order – a "flat rate" pension. Not all firefighters serving in 1966 and 1972 took up the option for spouse's benefits based on a proportion of their own service and benefit entitlement and so flat rate pensions remained an optional alternative. Even the FPS Order 1992 contains flat rate provisions. They are set out in Rule E9 and explained in the relevant part of this Commentary. (Annexe 6 explains provisions for "1956 Optants".)

The history of spouse's (and children's) pensions are given on pages B Gen 1, C Gen 1 and 2, D Gen 2 and in Annexe 5. The explanation and background given in those parts of the Commentary are to enable the correct assessment of flat rate awards under the FPSO 1992.

But what about flat rate pension provision in respect of firefighters who retired before 1 March 1992?

As time passes, administrators may find it difficult to decide the amount of flat rate pension relevant to a firefighter subject to one of the earlier Firemen's Pension Scheme Orders. The purpose of this Annexe is to help them identify the amount due. It also explains how to revalue those pensions in line with Pensions Increase Orders.

Pensions Increase

Until 1980, a flat rate pension was not treated as an "official pension" for purposes of Pensions Increase Acts and Orders. Consequently, instead of increasing any flat rate pension in line with Pensions Increase Orders as they were issued, pensions administrators would wait until they were advised by the Home Office of the new basic level of flat rate pension.

This changed with effect from 24 November 1980 when the Firemen's Pension Scheme (Amendment) (No. 3) Order 1980 (SI 1980/1615) came into effect. This Order set a new basic level for each of the flat rate pensions mentioned in all the 7 Firemen's Pension Schemes that had been in force at some time since the end of World War II, i.e. –

- The Firemen's Pension Scheme Order 1948 from 1 April 1948
- The Firemen's Pension Scheme Order 1952 from 16 May 1952
- The Firemen's Pension Scheme Order 1956 from 10 July 1956
- The Firemen's Pension Scheme Order 1964 from 1 August 1964
- The Firemen's Pension Scheme Order 1966 from 26 August 1966
- The Firemen's Pension Scheme Order 1971 from 15 February 1971
- The Firemen's Pension Scheme Order 1973 from 1 July 1973

The new basic rates of flat rate pension are inserted into each of these 7 Orders by the addition of a Schedule 3A. In each Schedule 3A it is explained that the rates are to be treated as if an official pension which began on 30 June 1978 having regard to relevant Pensions Increase Orders under section 59 of the Social Security Pensions Act 1975.

Pensions Increase (continued)

It should be noted that the first Pensions Increase Order made under section 59 was the Pensions Increase (Review) Order 1979, <u>not</u> the 1978 Order. The figures given in each Schedule 3A include a 1978 increase.

This last Home Office Circular issued which increased flat rate pensions was Circular 34/1979. On the left-hand side it sets out the "current" rates of flat rate pension as increased by the 1978 Pensions Increase Order. On the right hand side it sets out the rates of flat rate pension as they would be after the 1979 Pensions Increase Order. It is these latter rates that would be in force at the time the Firemen's Pension Scheme (Amendment) (No. 3) Order 1980 was introduced. The Amendment Order takes the rates back to the 1978 Increase level. This is why, in the following notes, the "new" rates set by the Amendment Order are less than "old".

Care should be taken when bringing any of these flat rate pensions up to their current level. So many years have passed since the rates were set by the Amendment Order that pensions administrators will probably use the Pensions Increase "multiplier" factors issued annually by HM Treasury. These factors bring the flat rate pension up to current levels in a single "compound" calculation. If the Treasury factors are not used, the flat rate pension would have to be increased by the laborious process of applying the relevant Pensions Increase rate of each successive year in a rather lengthy series of calculations.

However, the problem with using the Treasury multiplier is that the "beginning date" for the flat rate pension is given in Schedule 3A as 30 June 1978. If this beginning date is used when referring to the Treasury multiplier, the factor given will include the 1978 Pensions Increase. To get around the problem, a beginning date of 28 November 1978 could be substituted. This would allow the convenience of being able to use the Treasury multiplier but would ensure that the relevant factor did not incorrectly inflate the flat rate pension by adding in a second helping of the 1978 Pensions Increase.

Working with The Firemen's Pension Scheme (Amendment) (No. 3) Order 1980 The Amendment Order which introduced the new basic rates of flat rate pensions is quite complex. It overrides the provisions for flat rate pensions in each of the 7 main Orders by referring to a new Schedule 3A. The drafting of the amendments is rather complicated to follow. Care should be taken with Orders from 1956 onwards because these Orders will have additional special rates for "1956 Optants".

Although the rates for all the different types of flat rate pension are given in Chart 1 which follows, it is probable that it will only be the rates for the widow's ordinary pension which a pensions administrator may be required to establish nowadays. To do this, the administrator will first need to establish when the firefighter retired in order to know which of the FPS Orders was in force at the time of retirement. The effective dates of each of the main Orders are given on the previous page. (The 1992 Order came into force on 1 March 1992.)

Working with The Firemen's Pension Scheme (Amendment) (No. 3) Order 1980 (continued) Chart 1 on the following pages explains which parts of the relevant main Order have been amended and the rates which apply in accordance with the Schedule 3A added to that Order by the Amendment Order.

In most cases it will also be necessary to note from the firefighter's pension record –

- his rank at retirement
- his length of service at retirement

and, as explained above, if he retired on or after 10 July 1956, it will have to be established if he was a "1956 Optant", i.e. a member who chose <u>not</u> to become subject to the 1956 Scheme and in respect of whom special rates of flat rate pension would apply.
